Will (Can) the Circle Be Unbroken is a popular hymn written in 1907 by Ada Habershon with music by Charles H. Gabriel. This is a gospel revival version in the public domain, and has a slightly different tune than is commonly recorded. The more popular version is a reworked version, intended as a funeral hymn, and was written by A.P. Carter, then released in 1935 for the Carter Family under the name Can the Circle Be Unbroken, with different lyrics and a modified chorus. Mother Maybelle Carter performed it in 1972 and is the Maybelle referred to in the lyrics. Nitty Gritty Dirt Band also famously performs it as does Johnny Cash. These lyrics are NOT in the public domain.
